Confidentiality of Data and Information

- Must comply with confidentiality requirements of 34 U.S.C. §10231 and 28 C.F.R. Part 22 that are applicable to collection, use, and revelation of data or information
- Must submit a Privacy Certificate in accordance with 28 C.F.R. Part 22, Section 22.23

Criminal Intelligence Systems

For any information technology system funded or supported with this JAG project, the Subgrantee shall conform to criminal intelligence systems operating policies and requirements

• 28 C.F.R. Part 23

Information Technology/Sharing

- Compliance with the DOJ's Global Justice Information Sharing Initiative guidelines and recommendations for this grant, where applicable
- Shall conform to the Global Standards Package (GSP) and all constituent elements and shall document planned approaches to information sharing and describe compliance to the GSP

National Instant Background Check System

- Shall assure that "eligible records" will be made available to the Kansas repository/database that is electronically available to the National Instant Background Check System (NCIS)
 - Court dispositions or Information (formal criminal charge)
- 18 U.S.C. §922 and 34 U.S.C. ch. 409

DNA Testing

- When JAG funds are used for DNA testing of evidentiary materials:
 - Subgrantee shall upload resulting eligible DNA profiles to the FBIs Combined DNA Index System (CODIS)
 - Subgrantee must obtain prior approval from the KGGP to enter or upload DNA profiles into any non-governmental DNA database
 - JAG funds shall not be used for the purchase of DNA equipment and supplies when DNA profiles may not be accepted for entry into CODIS

Forensic Genealogy Testing

- Forensic genealogy testing supported by JAG funds:
 - Subgrantees must adhere to U.S. Department of Justice Interim Policy Forensic Genealogical DNA Analysis and Searching

Facial Recognition Technology

- For any Facial Recognition Technology (FRT) purchased or used with JAG funds, the Subgrantee shall have policies and procedures in place to ensure the FRT will be utilized in an appropriate and responsible manner that promotes public safety, and protects privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties.
- A copy of such policies and procedures must be provided to the KGGP no less than 30 days prior to the use of JAG funds for this purpose.

Computer Networks

- Funds must not be used to maintain or establish a computer network unless such network blocks viewing, downloading and exchanging of pornography
- Does not limit the use of funds for carrying out criminal investigations, prosecution, or adjudication activities
